23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated
25	from the named funds for the 2015-2016 fiscal year to the
26	state agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the

expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the following definitions shall be applicable.

"Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total of all fund sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

"Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

"Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts, grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016, to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such other funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be expended for the items for which the appropriation is herein made shall not exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 through 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, however, that regardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay date falls.

The above appropriation to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board includes a transfer to the State General Fund of \$13,494,000 to be made in four equal amounts at the beginning of each quarter of the fiscal year. In addition to the above appropriation herein made, there is hereby appropriated for each additional retail and wholesale store that is relocated or put into operation during the fiscal year, an amount equal to the sum required to install and operate a comparable store in operation by said Board. There is further appropriated to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, after provision has been made for the other expenditures herein authorized, such sums as are or may be necessary to purchase the alcoholic beverages which are essential to maintain adequate stocks and inventory for an economic and successful sales operation. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby conditionally appropriated any and all amounts from tobacco settlement or litigation for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016. The amounts are conditioned upon the State of Alabama receiving revenue from tobacco settlement or litigation and upon the recommendation of the Director of Finance, the Chairs of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee and the Senate Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the approval of the Governor. The conditional appropriation made herein shall be allocated pursuant to Sections 41-10-620 through 41-10-639 and Sections 41-15B-1 through 41-15B-6, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 7. Except as may be herein otherwise provided, amounts herein specifically appropriated shall be in lieu of the amounts heretofore provided or appropriated by law for such purposes. The amounts herein appropriated are the maximum amounts to be expended for the purposes herein designated and in no event shall the maximum expenditure provided for any items of expense exceed the amount allocated herein except as may be provided for under Sections 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 11, 12, and 15 of this bill, as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and those appropriations herein made, except appropriations to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the purchase of alcoholic beverages, are and shall be

subject to the terms, conditions, provisions and limitations of Sections 41-4-80 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 8. Any surplus remaining in any appropriation herein made from the State General Fund to any office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency may be transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency.

Section 9. In addition to appropriations herein made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions or entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in the bill, including grants by the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties, to any department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the

State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by said agency. All such sums are hereby appropriated and reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts for audit services, to be expended through the fund established by Section 41-5-24, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 10. The Department of Examiners of Public Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5, Code of Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery audits as provided for in Section 41-5-6.1, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 11. Upon certification to the Director of Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such department, board, bureau or commission in the amount necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are

conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are not available for the court-ordered payments.

Section 12. All interest earned from funds paid into Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

Section 13. All encumbered balances of a previous fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions authorized by this Act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal year immediately following the fiscal year for which the appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the appropriation or appropriations were made.

Section 14. The appropriations made herein to the departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include the amounts necessary and said departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in

this act and receiving services from other governmental agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for such services.

Section 15. All funds collected under Section 40-12-43.1 between the effective date of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2015 are hereby appropriated to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for the administration of the examiner certification program established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1.

Section 16. Any agency or entity receiving appropriations from the State General Fund or transferring funds into the State General Fund for fiscal year 2016 in this act shall reduce direct services to the public and payments to individuals as a last resort. Any spending cuts necessitated by the reductions in appropriations from the State General Fund or due to transfers into the State General Fund shall come from administrative functions prior to any cuts being made to direct services to Alabamians and payments to recipients of governmental programs. Each agency or entity shall report quarterly to the Chairs of the Senate Finance and Taxation-General Fund and the House Ways and Means General Fund Committees on the categories of expenditure reductions for fiscal year 2016 from fiscal year 2015.

Section 17. Funds appropriated from the State General Fund or earmarked state funds in this act to any state department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, or office shall not be expended for capital outlay purposes for the construction of new buildings and/or related facilities. This restriction shall not apply to expenditures made from bond proceeds or expenses related to buildings and facilities where construction began or contracts for construction that were entered into prior to the effective date of this act. A state agency may request to make capital outlay expenditures for construction purposes in the event of a natural disaster or for other emergency purposes. The request shall be made in writing to the Director of Finance, the Chair of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee, and the Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee. The request shall explain the nature of the construction and the emergency involved. The request shall be approved unanimously by the Director of Finance, the Chair of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee, and the Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee prior to incurring the capital outlay expenses for construction of buildings and/or related facilities. Section 18. (a) Funds appropriated from the State

Section 18. (a) Funds appropriated from the State General Fund or earmarked state funds in this act to any state department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, or office shall not be expended for the purchase

1 of or lease of new automotive vehicles. This prohibition shall 2 not apply to renewals of existing leases of automotive vehicles. A state department, division, board, bureau, 3 commission, agency, institution, or office may request to 5 purchase or lease automotive vehicles for emergency purposes. The request shall be made in writing to the Director of 6 7 Finance, the Chair of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee, and the Chair of the Senate Finance and 8 9 Taxation-General Fund Committee. The request shall explain the 10 nature of the automotive purchase or lease and the emergency 11 need for the vehicle. The request shall be approved 12 unanimously by the Director of Finance, the Chair of the House 13 Ways and Means General Fund Committee, and the Chair of the 14 Senate Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee prior to 15 the purchase or lease of any automotive vehicle.

(b) No funds appropriated in this act shall be expended for the purpose of purchasing optional equipment on state motor vehicles that is unnecessary for the proper functioning of the automobile or safety of the driver and passengers, such as stereo equipment, power seats, leather upholstery, premium wheel covers, deluxe exterior trim, or sunroofs.

Section 19. Any agency or entity, which under the provisions of Act 2015-327 utilizes funds for the operation of such agency or entity for a purpose other than the purpose for which the funds were dedicated, shall report such information

to the Chairs of the House Ways and Means General Fund
Committee, the House Ways and Means Education Committee, the
Senate Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the
Senate Finance and Taxation-Education Committee and the
Legislative Fiscal Officer on a quarterly basis.

Section 20. It is the intent of the Legislature that the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President Pro Tempore in subsection 8 of Section 2A of this act which are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 21. The appropriations made herein to the departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include the amounts necessary to pay the State Employees' Insurance Board (SEIB). The SEIB rate shall be \$850 per month for each full-time employee for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016. The State Employees' Insurance Board will adjust the insurance program wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned fixed rate.

Section 22. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the

1 Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of 2 any type, including contracting, of any of the funds appropriated in this act. 3 Section 23. If any section, paragraph, sentence, 4 5 clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or 6 7 invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, 8 sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any 9 other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof 10 hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid. Section 24. All laws or parts of laws, general, 11 12 special, private or local that are in conflict with or 13 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby 14 expressly repealed. Section 25. Each agency of the State funded through 15 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity 16 17 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of 18 this state without regard to sex or race. 19 Section 26. This act shall become effective October
