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8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, termination dates are
9 established for enumerated state agencies. The
10 agencies are periodically reviewed by the Alabama
11 Sunset Committee. After the review process is
12 completed, the committee prepares its
13 recommendations for the agencies to the Legislature
14 in the form of sunset bills which either continue,
15 terminate, or continue with modification each
16 agency reviewed.

17 This bill would provide for the continuance
18 of the Alabama Board of Cosmetology and Barbering
19 until October 1, 2020, with the following changes:
20 To exempt Class 2 barbers from regulation by the
21 board.

1 Relating to the Alabama Sunset Law; to continue the
2 existence and functioning of the Alabama Board of Cosmetology
3 and Barbering with certain modifications; to amend Section
4 34-7B-13, Code of Alabama 1975, as amended by Act 2015-406,
5 2015 Regular Session, so as to exempt Class 2 barbers from
6 regulation by the board.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

8 Section 1. Pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law, the
9 Sunset Committee recommends the continuance of the Alabama
10 Board of Cosmetology and Barbering until October 1, 2020, with
11 the additional recommendation for statutory change as set out
12 in Section 3.

13 Section 2. The existence and functioning of the
14 Alabama Board of Cosmetology and Barbering, created and
15 functioning pursuant to Sections 34-7B-1 to 34-7B-29,
16 inclusive, Code of Alabama 1975, is continued until October 1,
17 2020, and those code sections are expressly preserved.

18 Section 3. Section 34-7B-13 of the Code of Alabama
19 1975, as amended by Act 2015-406, 2015 Regular Session, is
20 amended to read as follows:

21 "§34-7B-13.

22 "This chapter does not apply to any of the following
23 persons, activities, or services:

24 "(1) Service in the case of emergency or domestic
25 upheaval, without compensation.

26 "(2) Licensed medical professionals operating within
27 the scope of their normal practice.

1 "(3) Personnel of the United States armed services
2 performing their ordinary duties.

3 "(4) Any public trade school or other public school
4 or school program under the purview of the State Board of
5 Education or a local board of education.

6 "(5) Any person who only occasionally dresses hair
7 and receives no compensation therefor, or does any other act
8 or thing mentioned in this chapter, without holding himself or
9 herself out to the public as a provider of any practices
10 defined in this chapter for compensation.

11 "(6) Departments in retail establishments where
12 cosmetics are demonstrated and offered for sale but where no
13 other acts of cosmetology or barbering are performed.

14 "(7) The licensees of any county or municipal barber
15 board or commission in existence on August 1, 2013, unless
16 such board or commission elects, by resolution adopted by the
17 governing body of the county or municipality, to come under
18 the provisions of this chapter.

19 "(8) Any person who practices as a Class 1 barber.

20 "(9) Any person who practices as a Class 2 barber."

21 Section 4. The Legislature concurs in the
22 recommendations of the Sunset Committee as provided in
23 Sections 1, 2, and 3.

24 Section 5. This act shall become effective
25 immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or
26 its otherwise becoming law.
