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A BILL
TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

To make supplemental appropriations from the Education Trust Fund Advancement and Technology Fund for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, to the public institutions of higher education in the amount of \$273,700,000, and to the Department of Education, the Board of Trustees of the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind, the Board of Youth Services School Districts, the Board of Directors of the Alabama School of Fine Arts, the Board of Trustees of the Alabama School of Math and Science, and the Board of Trustees of the Alabama School of Cyber Technology and Engineering in the amount of \$726,300,000.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated a total of \$273,700,000 from the Education Trust Fund Advancement and Technology Fund to the public institutions of higher education for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024. This appropriation shall be expended as provided in Section 29-9-4, Code of Alabama 1975. This appropriation shall be distributed as follows:

217 (b) Notwithstanding any other laws to the contrary, the
 218 funds appropriated to the Department of Education by
 219 subsection (a) of this section shall not be expended without
 220 prior approval of the State Superintendent of Education.

221 (c) (1) The above appropriation for teacher professional
 222 development shall be allocated to the Alabama Department of
 223 Education to be distributed to the Ed Farm Classroom of
 224 Tomorrow. These funds will be used by Ed Farm to provide
 225 technology tools and professional development services to
 226 classroom teachers in an effort to improve instruction and
 227 student learning gains. It is the intent of the legislature
 228 that in addition to general programmatic costs, Ed Farm may
 229 also expend funds for software, hardware, administrative
 230 costs, and professional learning services.



231 (2) The State Superintendent shall provide a report of
232 the initiative to the Chair of the House Ways and
233 Means-Education Committee and the Chair of the Senate
234 Committee on Finance and Taxation-Education no later than
235 October 1, 2025.

236 Section 4. All funds not expended in the current
237 fiscal year shall not revert but be carried forward for the
238 purpose appropriated.

239 Section 5. This act shall become effective immediately.
