

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO S.C.R. 1004

(Reference to printed resolution)

1 Page 1, before line 1, insert:

2 "Whereas, the United States of America became an
3 independent, sovereign nation for the reasons expressed in the
4 Declaration of Independence and as the result of a bloody war to
5 achieve its independence; and

6 Whereas, the Constitution of the United States of America
7 is, and rightfully must remain, the Supreme Law of the Land; and

8 Whereas, the Constitution of the United States of America
9 provides for limited, nondelegable and diffused powers of
10 governments that are separated among the Congress, the President
11 and the judiciary and that preserve the powers and duties of the
12 individual states and the people; and

13 Whereas, the Constitution of the United States of America
14 guarantees personal liberties of each individual citizen; and

15 Whereas, the Charter of the United Nations purports to
16 supersede the independence and sovereignty of the United States
17 and the Constitution of the United States of America and to usurp
18 powers delegated in the Constitution by:

19 1. Concentrating in the United Nations Security Council
20 control and use of certain American military personnel and the
21 military personnel of all member nations for its own purposes
22 without any accountability and in violation of the exclusive
23 power of the United States Congress to declare war.

24 2. Seeking authority to tax citizens of the United States
25 and other member nations directly to support United Nation
26 activities.

27 3. Sponsoring and extending to all nations, whether
28 signatories or not, an International Criminal Court that violates

1 the rights of the accused as well as the Constitution of the
2 United States and the Bill of Rights; and

3 Whereas, the oil-for-food effort in Iraq has been a global
4 scandal that enriched Saddam Hussein and his inner circle,
5 leaving the Iraqi people further deprived, and further enabled
6 him to acquire arms and munitions that were used against United
7 States forces, all occurring under the supervision of the United
8 Nations; and

9 Whereas, in the past, a United States representative
10 introduced a bill in Congress known as the American Sovereignty
11 Restoration Act of 2005. This important legislation, H.R. 1146,
12 would have ended the membership of the United States in the
13 United Nations; and

14 Whereas, the only benefit to the United States of America
15 of belonging to the United Nations is our country's veto
16 authority on the Security Council to protect our allies, such as
17 the Nation of Israel; and

18 Whereas, H.R. 1146 would have repealed the United Nations
19 Participation Act of 1945, the United Nations Headquarters
20 Agreement Act and various other related laws. The bill would
21 have prevented the authorization of further monies for United
22 Nations military operations and would terminate the participation
23 of the United States in United Nations peacekeeping operations;
24 and

25 Whereas, the Constitution and bylaws of the United Nations
26 frequently conflict with the Constitution and laws of the United
27 States. Over the years, past presidents have unconstitutionally
28 transferred their authority to the United Nations commanders
29 without the consent of Congress.

30 Therefore"

Senate Amendments to S.C.R. 1004

1 Page 1, strike lines 3 through 14, insert:

2 "1. That, at such time that the United States of America ceases to use
3 its veto authority in the United Nations Security Council to protect our
4 allies such as Israel, the Members of the Legislature support the Congress of
5 the United States in taking immediate steps to ensure the passage of the
6 American Sovereignty Restoration Act, or similar legislation, and in taking
7 any other measures necessary to dissolve the membership of the United States
8 in the United Nations.

9 2. That the Secretary of State of the State of Arizona transmit copies
10 of this Resolution to the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker
11 of the United States House of Representatives and each Member of Congress
12 from the State of Arizona."

13 Amend title to conform

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
