HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AMENDMENTS TO H.B. 2282

(Reference to printed bill)

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert:

2 "Section 1. Section 41-725, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 41-725. Comprehensive database of receipts and expenditures of
5 state monies

6 A. On or before January 1, 2011, the department shall establish and
7 maintain an official internet website that is electronically searchable by
8 the public at no cost and that contains a comprehensive database of receipts
9 and expenditures of state monies.

10 B. The department must present information in the database in a manner
11 that is intuitive to members of the general public, including graphical
12 representations. The database must allow users to:

13 1. Search and aggregate payments by individual budget units and
14 programs.

15 2. Search and aggregate payments by individual vendors, including the
16 total amount of state funding awarded by all budget units to individual
17 vendors.

18 3. Download information yielded by a search of the database.

19 4. **CROSS-LINK EXPENDITURES ASSOCIATED WITH CONTRACTS OR SUBCONTRACTS**
20 **TO THE ACTUAL LANGUAGE OF THE CONTRACT OR SUBCONTRACT.**

21 C. The database shall include the following information:

22 1. Annual receipts of revenues, including:

23 (a) Receipts or deposits by each state budget unit into funds
24 established in the state treasury.

25 (b) Taxes.

26 (c) Earnings by each budget unit, including amounts collected for
27 merchandise sold, services performed and licenses, certifications and permits
28 issued.

1 (d) Revenue from the use of publicly owned money or property,
2 including leases and licenses.

3 (e) Gifts, donations and grants received, including amounts received
4 from the federal government.

5 (f) Any other type of public revenue, however denominated or derived,
6 deposited into the state treasury.

7 2. Annual expenditures and disbursements of state revenues by each
8 state budget unit from funds established in the state treasury, as
9 applicable, including:

10 (a) Bond payments, debt service and redemption charges and fees.

11 (b) Contractual services and cooperative agreements.

12 (c) Commodities.

13 (d) Capital outlay.

14 (e) Revenue sharing and other aid to other levels of government,
15 including tribal governments.

16 (f) Any other expenditure or disbursement of state revenue from the
17 state treasury, however denominated or structured.

18 D. Expenditure data shall list:

19 1. The manner of payment, including check or warrant or credit, debit
20 or other purchase card.

21 2. The funding source, including categorical codes and the state
22 accounts the expenditure is appropriated from.

23 3. A standardized descriptive title of the type and purpose of the
24 transaction.

25 4. The date and amount of each payment.

26 5. The state agency or budget unit making the payment.

27 6. The name of the person or entity receiving the payment, including
28 to the extent practical a parent entity of the recipient if the recipient is
29 owned by another entity.

30 7. The primary location of performance under the contract, including
31 the county, city or town and legislative district.

32 E. The database shall not include:

1 1. Tax payment or refund data that include confidential taxpayer
2 information.

3 2. Data relating to payments of state assistance to individual
4 recipients.

5 3. Payees' addresses or telephone numbers, but the department may
6 allow public access in the database to information identifying the county in
7 which the payee is located.

8 4. Work product in anticipation of litigation or information subject
9 to attorney-client privilege.

10 5. Any other information that is designated by law as confidential or
11 preapproved as confidential by the department pursuant to rule. The
12 department and any officer or employee of the department:

13 (a) May rely on a determination made by a budget unit regarding
14 confidentiality of information relating to the budget unit's expenditures.

15 (b) Are immune from civil liability for posting confidential
16 information under this section if the posting is in reliance on the budget
17 unit's determination relating to confidentiality.

18 F. Each budget unit shall cooperate with the department as necessary
19 to implement and administer this section. Each budget unit shall provide to
20 the department any additional data in a manner and schedule prescribed by the
21 department that are required to be included in the database. The database
22 shall be updated within thirty days after the end of each fiscal year and may
23 be updated as new data become available. The data shall be retained in the
24 database for at least ten full fiscal years.

25 G. The governor, secretary of state, state treasurer and legislature
26 shall include a link to the database under this section in their individual
27 official websites. Each budget unit that maintains a generally accessible
28 internet website, or for which a generally accessible website is maintained,
29 shall include a link on that website to the database under this section.

30 H. ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2012, EACH LOCAL GOVERNMENT SHALL ESTABLISH
31 AND MAINTAIN AN OFFICIAL INTERNET WEBSITE THAT IS ELECTRONICALLY SEARCHABLE
32 BY THE PUBLIC AT NO COST AND THAT CONTAINS A COMPREHENSIVE DATABASE OF

1 RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURES OF LOCAL MONIES IN AS NEARLY AS PRACTICABLE THE
2 SAME MANNER AND CONSISTENT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTIONS B THROUGH E.

3 I. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION "LOCAL GOVERNMENT" MEANS:

4 1. ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THIS STATE, INCLUDING A COUNTY, CITY
5 OR TOWN WITH A POPULATION OF MORE THAN TWENTY-FIVE HUNDRED PERSONS.

6 2. ANY COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT AND SCHOOL DISTRICT HAVING A STUDENT
7 COUNT OF MORE THAN SIX HUNDRED PUPILS."
