HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AMENDMENTS TO S.B. 1274

(Reference to Senate engrossed bill)

1 Page 1, after line 45, insert:

2 "Sec. 2. Section 28-363, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

3 **28-363. Duties of the director: administration**

4 A. The director shall:

5 1. Supervise and administer the overall activities of the department
6 and its divisions and employees.

7 2. Appoint assistant directors for each of the divisions.

8 3. Provide for the assembly and distribution of information to the
9 public concerning department activities.

10 4. Delegate functions, duties or powers as the director deems
11 necessary to carry out the efficient operation of the department.

12 5. Exercise complete and exclusive operational control and
13 jurisdiction over the use of state highways and routes.

14 6. Coordinate the design, right-of-way purchase and construction of
15 controlled access highways that are either state routes or state highways and
16 related grade separations of controlled access highways.

17 7. Coordinate the design, right-of-way purchase, construction,
18 standard and reduced clearance grade separation, extension and widening of
19 arterial streets and highways under chapters 17 and 18 of this title.

20 8. Assist regional transportation planning agencies, councils of
21 government, tribal governments, counties, cities and towns in the development
22 of their regional and local transportation plans to ensure that the streets,
23 highways and other regionally significant modes of transportation within each
24 county form an integrated and efficient regional system.

25 9. On or before December 1, present an annual report to the speaker of
26 the house of representatives and the president of the senate documenting the
27 expenditures of monies under chapters 17 and 18 of this title during the
28 previous fiscal year relating to the design, right-of-way purchase or

1 construction of controlled access highways that are accepted in the state
2 highway system as state routes or state highways or related grade separations
3 of controlled access highways that are included in the regional
4 transportation plans of the counties.

5 10. Designate the necessary agencies for enforcing the provisions of
6 the laws the director administers or enforces.

7 11. Exercise other duties or powers as the director deems necessary to
8 carry out the efficient operation of the department.

9 12. Cooperate with the Arizona-Mexico commission in the governor's
10 office and with researchers at universities in this state to collect data and
11 conduct projects in the United States and Mexico on issues that are within
12 the scope of the department's duties and that relate to quality of life,
13 trade and economic development in this state in a manner that will help the
14 Arizona-Mexico commission to assess and enhance the economic competitiveness
15 of this state and of the Arizona-Mexico region.

16 13. Develop a plan to increase use of bypass routes by vehicles on days
17 of poor visibility in the Phoenix metropolitan area.

18 14. DEVELOP, PILOT OR IMPLEMENT VIRTUAL OR ELECTRONIC CREDENTIALS,
19 RECORDS, PROCEDURES, PROCESSES AND SYSTEMS AS THE DIRECTOR DEEMS NECESSARY TO
20 CARRY OUT THE FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES OF THE DEPARTMENT.

21 B. The assistant directors appointed pursuant to subsection A of this
22 section are subject to title 41, chapter 4, article 4.

23 C. The director shall not spend any monies, adopt any rules or
24 implement any policies or programs to convert signs to the metric system or
25 to require the use of the metric system with respect to designing or
26 preparing plans, specifications, estimates or other documents for any highway
27 project before the conversion or use is required by federal law, except that
28 the director may:

29 1. Spend monies and require the use of the metric system with respect
30 to designing or preparing plans, specifications, estimates or other documents
31 for a highway project that is awarded before October 1, 1997 and that is
32 exclusively metric from its inception.

33 2. Prepare for conversion to and use of the metric system not more
34 than six months before the conversion or use is required by federal law."

1 Page 6, between lines 4 and 5, insert:

2 "Sec. 8. Section 28-3169, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to
3 read:

4 28-3169. Possession and display of driver license; defense

5 A. A licensee shall have a legible driver license in the licensee's
6 immediate possession at all times when operating a motor vehicle. On demand
7 of a justice of the peace, a police officer or a field deputy or inspector of
8 the department, a licensee shall display the license. IF THE DEPARTMENT
9 IMPLEMENTS PROCEDURES FOR VIRTUAL OR ELECTRONIC DRIVER LICENSES, THE DRIVER
10 LICENSE MAY BE DISPLAYED ON A WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICE THAT IS IN THE
11 MOTOR VEHICLE. IF A PERSON DISPLAYS THE DRIVER LICENSE ON A WIRELESS
12 COMMUNICATION DEVICE PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION, THE PERSON IS NOT
13 CONSENTING FOR A JUSTICE OF THE PEACE, A POLICE OFFICER OR A FIELD DEPUTY OR
14 INSPECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT TO ACCESS OTHER CONTENTS OF THE WIRELESS
15 COMMUNICATION DEVICE.

16 B. A person who is served a complaint for violating this section is
17 not responsible if the person produces in court or the office of the police
18 officer or field deputy or inspector of the department a legible driver
19 license, A VIRTUAL OR ELECTRONIC DRIVER LICENSE or an authorized duplicate of
20 the license issued to the person that was valid at the time of the alleged
21 violation of this section. A COURT MAY REQUIRE A PERSON TO PRODUCE A LEGIBLE
22 DRIVER LICENSE, NOT INCLUDING A VIRTUAL OR ELECTRONIC DRIVER LICENSE, OR AN
23 AUTHORIZED DUPLICATE OF THE LICENSE FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION."
