COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC SAFETY  
HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AMENDMENTS TO H.B. 2189  
(Reference to printed bill)

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert:

2 "Section 1. Section 41-1821, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4       41-1821. Arizona peace officer standards and training board;  
5                   membership; appointment; term; vacancies; meetings;  
6                   compensation; acceptance of grants

7       A. The Arizona peace officer standards and training board is  
8 established and consists of thirteen members appointed by the governor.  
9 The membership shall include:

10      1. Two sheriffs, one **OF WHOM IS** appointed from a county having a  
11 population of two hundred thousand or more persons and the remaining  
12 sheriff **WHO IS** appointed from a county having a population of less than two  
13 hundred thousand persons.

14      2. Two chiefs of **city** police, one **OF WHOM IS** appointed from a city  
15 **OR FEDERALLY RECOGNIZED NATIVE AMERICAN TRIBE** having a population of sixty  
16 thousand or more persons and the remaining chief **WHO IS** appointed from a  
17 city **OR FEDERALLY RECOGNIZED NATIVE AMERICAN TRIBE** having a population of  
18 less than sixty thousand persons.

19      3. A college faculty member in public administration or a related  
20 field.

21      4. The attorney general.  
22      5. The director of the department of public safety.  
23      6. The director of the state department of corrections.

1           7. One member who is employed in administering county or municipal  
2           correctional facilities.

3           8. Two certified law enforcement officers who have knowledge of and  
4           experience in representing peace officers in disciplinary cases. One of  
5           the certified law enforcement officers must have a rank of officer and the  
6           other must have a rank of deputy. One of the appointed officers must be  
7           from a county with a population of less than five hundred thousand persons.

8           9. Two public members.

9           B. Before appointment by the governor, a prospective member of the  
10          board shall submit a full set of fingerprints to the governor for the  
11          purpose of obtaining a state and federal criminal records check pursuant to  
12          section 41-1750 and Public Law 92-544. The department of public safety may  
13          exchange this fingerprint data with the federal bureau of investigation.

14          C. The governor shall appoint a chairman from among the members at  
15          its first meeting and every year thereafter, except that an ex officio  
16          member shall not be appointed chairman. The governor shall not appoint  
17          more than one member from the same law enforcement agency. No board member  
18          who was qualified when appointed becomes disqualified unless the member  
19          ceases to hold the office that qualified the member for appointment.

20          D. Meetings shall be held at least quarterly or on the call of the  
21          chairman or by the written request of five members of the board or by the  
22          governor. A vacancy on the board shall occur when a member except an ex  
23          officio member is absent without the permission of the chairman from three  
24          consecutive meetings. The governor may remove a member except an ex  
25          officio member for cause.

26          E. The term of each regular member is three years unless a member  
27          vacates the public office that qualified the member for this appointment.

28          F. The board members are not eligible to receive per diem but are  
29          eligible to receive reimbursement for travel expenses pursuant to title 38,  
30          chapter 4, article 2.

31          G. On behalf of the board, the executive director may seek and  
32          accept contributions, grants, gifts, donations, services or other financial

1 assistance from any individual, association, corporation or other  
2 organization having an interest in police training, and from the United  
3 States of America and any of its agencies or instrumentalities, corporate  
4 or otherwise. Only the executive director of the board may seek monies  
5 pursuant to this subsection. Such monies shall be deposited in the fund  
6 created by section 41-1825.

7 H. Membership on the board shall not constitute the holding of an  
8 office, and members of the board shall not be required to take and file  
9 oaths of office before serving on the board. No member of the board shall  
10 be disqualified from holding any public office or employment nor shall such  
11 member forfeit any such office or employment by reason of such member's  
12 appointment, notwithstanding the provisions of any general, special or  
13 local law, ordinance or city charter.

14 Sec. 2. Retention of members

15 Notwithstanding section 41-1821, Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended  
16 by this act, all persons serving as members of the Arizona peace officer  
17 standards and training board on the effective date of this act may continue  
18 to serve until the expiration of their normal terms. The governor shall  
19 make all subsequent appointments as prescribed by statute."
