1 Page 1, between lines 1 and 2, insert:

2 "Section 1. Laws 2018, chapter 312, section 5 is amended to read:

3 Sec. 5. Appropriations; peace officer training equipment;  
public safety and court automation expenses

5 Notwithstanding section 41-1731, subsection C, paragraph 3, Arizona  
6 Revised Statutes, ~~as added by this act~~, monies in the peace officer  
7 training equipment fund established by section 41-1731, Arizona Revised  
8 Statutes, ~~as added by this act~~, are continuously appropriated until all of  
9 the following appropriations are made:

10 1. The first \$500,000 that is deposited in the peace officer  
11 training equipment fund established by section 41-1731, Arizona Revised  
12 Statutes, ~~as added by this act~~, is appropriated to the department of public  
13 safety for employee overtime pay.

14 2. The next \$2,300,000 is appropriated after the appropriation made  
15 in paragraph 1 of this section from the peace officer training equipment  
16 fund established by section 41-1731, Arizona Revised Statutes, ~~as added by~~  
17 ~~this act~~, to the department of public safety to purchase all of the  
18 following:

19 (a) Ten virtual firing ranges that:

20 (i) Are ballistically accurate to a degree of .08 milliradian, as  
21 verified by the United States army.

22 (ii) Take into account the exact weapon and round being fired.

1                   (iii) Emulate the real world as closely as possible, including  
2 ballistic fly-out projectiles, weapon behavior, projectile size,  
3 environmental effects and impact results.

4                   (iv) Will work with the virtual firing range simulators that are  
5 used by this state before ~~the effective date of this section~~ JANUARY 1,  
6 2019.

7                   (v) Are capable of generating unlimited custom high definition video  
8 scenarios, skill drills, targeting exercises and firearms training in any  
9 setting.

10                  (b) Three virtual training simulators, including one for the Tucson  
11 police department, one in Pinal county for the sheriff's office and one ~~in~~  
12 ~~Yuma county for the sheriff's office~~ FOR THE GLENDALE REGIONAL TRAINING  
13 ACADEMY. The virtual training simulators must:

14                  (i) Have the ability to display, and for the trainee to engage with,  
15 characters and scenario content simultaneously across at least a three  
16 hundred degree screen environment.

17                  (ii) Have the ability to accurately replicate real-world ballistic  
18 characteristics of a projectile in flight.

19                  (iii) Be equipped with transducers to recreate sound vibrations.

20                  (iv) Include a stress component, including the use of a wireless  
21 device capable of delivering an adjustable electric impulse, during  
22 training engagements.

23                  (c) Software that is used with the virtual firing ranges and virtual  
24 training simulators.

25                  3. The next ~~\$203,000~~ \$263,000 is appropriated after the  
26 ~~appropriation~~ APPROPRIATIONS made in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this section  
27 from the peace officer training equipment fund established by section  
28 41-1731, Arizona Revised Statutes, ~~as added by this act~~, to the department  
29 of public safety to maintain and service the seven existing virtual  
30 training simulators in this state.

31                  4. The next \$50,000 is appropriated after the appropriations made in  
32 paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of this section from the peace officer training

1 equipment fund established by section 41-1731, Arizona Revised Statutes, ~~as~~  
2 ~~added by this act~~, to the governor's office of highway safety to provide  
3 public service announcements that educate drivers in this state on how to  
4 act when subject to a peace officer's traffic stop.

5 5. The next \$20,000 is appropriated after the appropriations made in  
6 paragraphs 1, 2, 3 and 4 of this section from the peace officer training  
7 equipment fund established by section 41-1731, Arizona Revised Statutes, ~~as~~  
8 ~~added by this act~~, to the supreme court to cover a onetime programming  
9 cost."

9        equipment fund established by section 41-1731, Arizona Revised Statutes, to  
10      the department of public safety for new vehicles.

11          5. The next \$1,193,133 is appropriated after the appropriations made  
12        in paragraphs 1, 2, 3 and 4 of this subsection from the peace officer  
13        training equipment fund established by section 41-1731, Arizona Revised  
14        Statutes, to the department of public safety to distribute to the following  
15        county sheriffs in the following amounts for search and rescue costs:

- 16           (a) \$60,020 to the Apache county sheriff's office.
- 17           (b) \$89,200 to the Cochise county sheriff's office.
- 18           (c) \$31,300 to the Coconino county sheriff's office.
- 19           (d) \$57,773 to the Graham county sheriff's office.
- 20           (e) \$54,295 to the Navajo county sheriff's office.
- 21           (f) \$214,126 to the Pinal county sheriff's office.
- 22           (g) \$25,596 to the Santa Cruz county sheriff's office.
- 23           (h) \$80,540 to the Yavapai county sheriff's office.
- 24           (i) \$64,520 to the Gila county sheriff's office.
- 25           (j) \$54,269 to the Pima county sheriff's office.
- 26           (k) \$38,905 to the Yuma county sheriff's office.
- 27           (l) \$229,534 to the Maricopa county sheriff's office.
