A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING THE ASSESSMENT OF PENALTIES FOR SCHOOL BUS STOP**
102 **ARM VIOLATIONS.**

Bill Summary

The bill provides a mechanism for law enforcement agencies to issue penalty assessment notices to vehicle owners for school bus stop arm violations.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

1 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-1903, **amend**
2 (1) (b) (II) as follows:

3 **42-4-1903. School buses - stops - signs - passing.** (1) (b) (II) A
4 law enforcement agency may:

5 (A) Issue a citation on the basis of the information supplied to it
6 pursuant to subparagraph (I) of this paragraph (b) to the driver of the
7 vehicle involved in the violation; OR

8 (B) ISSUE A PENALTY ASSESSMENT NOTICE ON THE BASIS OF
9 INFORMATION OBTAINED BY LAW ENFORCEMENT TO THE REGISTERED
10 OWNER OF THE VEHICLE INVOLVED IN THE VIOLATION. **THE INFORMATION**
11 **MUST INCLUDE: THE COLOR, BASIC DESCRIPTION, AND LICENSE PLATE**
12 **NUMBER OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE INVOLVED IN THE VIOLATION;**
13 **INFORMATION PERTAINING TO THE ALLEGED VIOLATOR; AND THE TIME AND**
14 **APPROXIMATE LOCATION THE VIOLATION OCCURRED.**

15 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
16 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
17 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
18 10, 2016, if adjournment sine die is on May 11, 2016); except that, if a
19 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
20 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
21 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
22 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
23 November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
24 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
