## "AN ACT CONCERNING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF COMPLIANT ACCOUNTS BY PARTY COMMITTEES FOR EXPENDITURES ON STATE ELECTIONS."

After the last section, add the following and renumber sections and 1 2 internal references accordingly:

3 "Sec. 501. (NEW) (Effective from passage and applicable to any sale on and after said date) On and after the effective date of this section, no 5 state employee, as defined in section 1-79 of the general statutes, may enter into a contract with a state agency, as defined in section 1-79 of the general statutes, for the sale of a parcel of real property owned by such state employee, unless the Office of State Ethics has reviewed and 9 approved such sale. The state agency that is a party to any such 10 proposed sale shall submit notice of the proposed sale to the Office of State Ethics. The Office of State Ethics, after providing notice and an opportunity for public comment on any such proposed sale of not less 13 than fifteen days, shall issue its decision to approve or disapprove such

14 sale and send an electronic notice of decision to the state agency, 15 except that if the state agency certifies an emergency need for the acquisition of the property, the office shall expedite its review of the 16 17 sale and provide an opportunity for public comment of not less than 18 seven days and issue a decision not less than fifteen days after receipt 19 of the notice of sale. If the office fails to issue a decision not later than 20 thirty days after receipt of the notice of sale, or in the case of an 21 expedited review, fifteen days after receipt of the emergency 22 certification, the office shall be deemed to have approved such sale. 23 Any person aggrieved by the office's decision to disapprove such sale 24 may appeal such decision to the Superior Court, in accordance with 25 the provisions of section 4-183 of the general statutes."

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
