AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 2270 1 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend Senate Bill 2270 by replacing 2 3 everything after the enacting clause with the following: "Section 5. The Department of Public Health Powers and 4 Duties Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is 5 amended by adding Section 2310-228 as follows: 6 7 (20 ILCS 2310/2310-228 new) Sec. 2310-228. Nursing workforce database. 8 (a) The Department shall, in consultation with the Illinois 9 Coalition for Nursing Resources, the Illinois Nurses 10 Assocation, and other nursing associations, establish and 11 administer a nursing workforce database. The database shall be 12 assembled from data currently collected by State agencies or 13 departments that may be released under the Freedom of 14 Information Act and shall be maintained with the assistance of 15 16 the Department of Professional Regulation, the Department of Labor, the Department of Employment Security, and any other 17 State agency or department with access to nursing 18 workforce-related information. 19 (b) The objective of establishing the database shall be to 20 21 compile the following data related to the nursing workforce that is currently collected by State agencies or departments 22 that may be released under the Freedom of Information Act: 23 (1) Data on current and projected population 24

1	demographics and available health indicator data to								
2	determine how the population needs relate to the demand for								
3	nursing services.								
4	(2) Data to create a dynamic system for projecting								
5	nurse workforce supply and demand.								
6	(3) Data related to the development of a nursing								
7	workforce that considers the diversity, educational mix,								
8	geographic distribution, and number of nurses needed								
9	within the State.								
10	(4) Data on the current and projected numbers of nurse								
11	faculty who are needed to educate the nurses who will be								
12	needed to meet the needs of the residents of the State.								
13	(5) Data on nursing education programs within the State								
14	including number of nursing programs, applications,								
15	enrollments, and graduation rates.								
16	(6) Data needed to develop collaborative models								
17	between nursing education and practice to identify								
18	necessary competencies, educational strategies, and models								
19	of professional practice.								
20	(7) Data on nurse practice setting, practice								
21	locations, and specialties.								
22	(c) To accomplish the objectives set forth in subsection								
23	(b), data compiled by the Department into a database may be								
24	used by the Department, medical institutions and societies,								
25	health care facilities and associations of health care								
26	facilities, and nursing programs to assess current and								
27	projected nursing workforce shortfalls and develop strategies								
28	for overcoming them. Notwithstanding any other provision of								
29	law, the Department may not disclose any data that it compiles								
30	under this Section in a manner that would allow the								
31	identification of any particular health care professional or								
32	health care facility.								
33	(d) Nothing in this Section shall be construed as requiring								
34	any health care facility to file or submit any data,
