1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 4264

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 4264 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Barber, Cosmetology, Esthetics, Hair
5 Braiding, and Nail Technology Act of 1985 is amended by adding
6 Section 1-13 and by changing Sections 3-7, 3A-6, 3C-8, and 3E-5
7 as follows:

8 (225 ILCS 410/1-13 new)

9 Sec. 1-13. Liability; domestic violence and sexual
10 assault. A person licensed under this Act who is required to
11 undergo domestic violence and sexual assault awareness
12 education as a part of his or her continuing education shall
13 not be civilly or criminally liable for acting or failing to
14 act on information obtained during the course of employment
15 concerning potential domestic violence or sexual assault.

2 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2026)

3 Sec. 3-7. Licensure; renewal; continuing education. The
4 holder of a license issued under this Article III may renew
5 that license during the month preceding the expiration date
6 thereof by paying the required fee, giving such evidence as the
7 Department may prescribe of completing not less than 14 hours
8 of continuing education for a cosmetologist, and 24 hours of
9 continuing education for a cosmetology teacher or cosmetology
10 clinic teacher, within the 2 years prior to renewal. The
11 training shall be in subjects approved by the Department as
12 prescribed by rule upon recommendation of the Board and may
13 include online instruction. The continuing education for the
14 first renewal of a cosmetologist's license after the effective
15 date of this amendatory Act of the 99th General Assembly shall
16 include both domestic violence and sexual assault awareness
17 education as determined by rule of the Department. For every
18 subsequent renewal of a cosmetologist's license, the domestic
19 violence and sexual assault awareness education shall be an
20 optional course to help fulfill the continuing education
21 requirements.

22 The Department shall establish by rule a means for the
23 verification of completion of the continuing education
24 required by this Section. This verification may be accomplished
25 through audits of records maintained by registrants, by
26 requiring the filing of continuing education certificates with

1 the Department, or by other means established by the
2 Department.

3 The Department, in its discretion, may waive enforcement of
4 the continuing education requirement in this Section,
5 including the domestic violence and sexual assault awareness
6 education requirement, and shall adopt rules defining the
7 standards and criteria for that waiver under the following
8 circumstances:

9 (a) the licensee resides in a locality where it is
10 demonstrated that the absence of opportunities for such
11 education would interfere with the ability of the licensee
12 to provide service to the public;

13 (b) that to comply with the continuing education
14 requirements would cause a substantial financial hardship
15 on the licensee;

16 (c) that the licensee is serving in the United States
17 Armed Forces; or

18 (d) that the licensee is incapacitated due to illness.

21 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2026)

22 Sec. 3A-6. Licensure; renewal; continuing education;
23 examination; military service. The holder of a license issued
24 under this Article may renew such license during the month
25 preceding the expiration date thereof by paying the required

1 fee, giving evidence the Department may prescribe of completing
2 not less than 10 hours for estheticians, and not less than 20
3 hours of continuing education for esthetics teachers, within
4 the 2 years prior to renewal. The training shall be in
5 subjects, approved by the Department as prescribed by rule upon
6 recommendation of the Board. The continuing education for the
7 first renewal of an esthetician's license after the effective
8 date of this amendatory Act of the 99th General Assembly shall
9 include both domestic violence and sexual assault awareness
10 education as determined by rule of the Department. For every
11 subsequent renewal of an esthetician's license, the domestic
12 violence and sexual assault awareness education shall be an
13 optional course to help fulfill the continuing education
14 requirements.

15 The Department, in its discretion, may waive enforcement of
16 the continuing education requirement in this Section,
17 including the domestic violence and sexual assault awareness
18 education requirement, and shall adopt rules defining the
19 standards and criteria for such waiver, under the following
20 circumstances:

21 (1) the licensee resides in a locality where it is
22 demonstrated that the absence of opportunities for such
23 education would interfere with the ability of the licensee
24 to provide service to the public;

25 (2) the licensee's compliance with the continuing
26 education requirements would cause a substantial financial

1 hardship on the licensee;

2 (3) the licensee is serving in the United States Armed
3 Forces; or

4 (4) the licensee is incapacitated due to illness.

7 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2026)

8 Sec. 3C-8. License renewal; expiration; continuing
9 education; persons in military service. The holder of a license
10 issued under this Article may renew that license during the
11 month preceding the expiration date of the license by paying
12 the required fee and giving evidence, as the Department may
13 prescribe, of completing not less than 10 hours of continuing
14 education for a nail technician and 20 hours of continuing
15 education for a nail technology teacher, within the 2 years
16 prior to renewal. The continuing education shall be in subjects
17 approved by the Department upon recommendation of the Barber,
18 Cosmetology, Esthetics, Hair Braiding, and Nail Technology
19 Board relating to the practice of nail technology, including,
20 but not limited to, review of sanitary procedures, review of
21 chemical service procedures, review of this Act, and review of
22 the Workers' Compensation Act. However, at least 10 of the
23 hours of continuing education required for a nail technology
24 teacher shall be in subjects relating to teaching methodology,
25 educational psychology, and classroom management or in other

1 subjects related to teaching. The continuing education for the
2 first renewal of a nail technician's license after the
3 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 99th General
4 Assembly shall include both domestic violence and sexual
5 assault awareness education as determined by rule of the
6 Department. For every subsequent renewal of a nail technician's
7 license, the domestic violence and sexual assault awareness
8 education shall be an optional course to help fulfill the
9 continuing education requirements.

10 The Department, in its discretion, may waive enforcement of
11 the continuing education requirement in this Section,
12 including the domestic violence and sexual assault awareness
13 education requirement, and shall adopt rules defining the
14 standards and criteria for such waiver, under the following
15 circumstances:

16 (a) the licensee resides in a locality where it is
17 demonstrated that the absence of opportunities for such
18 education would interfere with the ability of the licensee
19 to provide service to the public;

20 (b) the licensee's compliance with the continuing
21 education requirements would cause a substantial financial
22 hardship on the licensee;

23 (c) the licensee is serving in the United States Armed
24 Forces; or

25 (d) the licensee is incapacitated due to illness.

2 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2026)

3 Sec. 3E-5. License renewal. To renew a license issued under
4 this Article, an individual must produce proof of successful
5 completion of 10 hours of continuing education for a hair
6 braider license and 20 hours of continuing education for a hair
7 braiding teacher license. The continuing education for the
8 first renewal of a hair braider's license after the effective
9 date of this amendatory Act of the 99th General Assembly shall
10 include both domestic violence and sexual assault awareness
11 education as determined by rule of the Department. For every
12 subsequent renewal of a hair braider's license, the domestic
13 violence and sexual assault awareness education shall be an
14 optional course to help fulfill the continuing education
15 requirements.
