HB 1134 # 27

DIGEST

Learning management system. Removes provisions in the bill. Requires, not later than July 1, 2023, each qualified school to use a web based learning management system. Requires a teacher or other employee of a qualified school, upon request, to allow a parent to review any learning material.

- 8 "Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "qualified school" means the
- 9 following:
- 10 (1) A school maintained by a school corporation.
- 11 (2) A charter school.
- 12 (3) A laboratory school established under IC 20-24.5-2.
- 13 (4) The Indiana School for the Blind and Visually Impaired
- 14 established by IC 20-21-2-1.
- 15 (5) The Indiana School for the Deaf established by
- 16 IC 20-22-2-1.
- 17 Sec. 2. (a) Each qualified school shall, not later than July 1,
- 18 2023, use a web based learning management system that:
- 19 (1) is used by each teacher of the qualified school;
- 20 (2) is accessible by each parent of a student and each student
- 21 enrolled in the qualified school; and
- 22 (3) allows a parent and student described in subdivision (2) to,
- 23 through the learning management system, contact the teacher
- 24 of each course, class, or program in which the student is
- 25 enrolled.
- 26 (b) A teacher or other employee of a qualified school shall allow
- 27 a parent to review any learning material requested by a parent of

1 a student enrolled in the qualified school.

2 **Sec. 3. Nothing in this chapter requires a qualified school to**
3 **provide information described in section 2 of this chapter in a**
4 **manner that would constitute an infringement of copyright under**
5 **the federal Copyright Act, 1017 U.S.C. 101 through 1332."**
