DIGEST

Quantity purchase agreement. Provides that if a nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities (qualified agency) withdraws from a department of administration (department) pilot project through which the qualified agency sells products or services to governmental bodies through a third party contractor, the department must award the qualified agency a quantity purchase agreement (QPA) for the same products and services and under the same terms under which the qualified agency had a QPA with the department before participating in the pilot project.

3	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE

6	(1) participates in a pilot project; and
7	(2) before the qualified agency's participation in the pilot
8	project, had a QPA awarded by the department to sell
9	products or services directly to governmental bodies that the
10	qualified agency currently sells through the third party
11	contractor under the pilot project.
12	(b) As used in this section, "department" refers to the Indiana
13	department of administration created by IC 4-13-1-2.
14	(c) As used in this section, "pilot project" refers to a project
15	established by the department through which a qualified agency
16	sells products or services covered by this chapter to governmental
17	bodies through a third party contractor that has been awarded a
18	contract by the department under this article.
19	(d) As used in this section, "QPA" refers to a quantity purchase
20	agreement.
21	(e) After a qualified agency withdraws from the pilot project, at
22	the request of the qualified agency, the department shall award to
23	the qualified agency a QPA for the same supplies or services that
24	the qualified agency provided through the third party contractor.

1	The department shall award a QPA to the qualified agency not
2	later than thirty (30) days after the date of the qualified agency's
3	request.
4	(f) The department shall award a QPA to the qualified party:
5	(1) without requiring a new procurement under this article;
6	and
7	(2) under the same terms and conditions under which the
8	qualified agency previously had a QPA with the department.
9	(g) This section does not release a qualified agency from any
10	contractual obligations that it might otherwise owe to the third
11	party contractor.
12	SECTION 3. An emergency is declared for this act.".
13	Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
