

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

SB 117 # 2

DIGEST

Confidential identifying information. Prohibits, after June 30, 2023, the broadcast of certain identifying information by police radio unless the broadcast is encrypted. Specifies that certain information is not public.

- 1 Page 11, after line 31, begin a new paragraph and insert:
2 "SECTION 3. IC 10-10.5-4 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
3 AS A **NEW CHAPTER** TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
4 JULY 1, 2022]:
5 **Chapter 4. Confidential Identifying Information**
6 **Sec. 1. After June 30, 2023, a law enforcement officer, a law**
7 **enforcement agency, or an employee of a law enforcement agency**
8 **may not broadcast:**
9 (1) a Social Security number;
10 (2) a driver's license number; or
11 (3) a state identification card number;
12 **over a police radio unless the broadcast is encrypted.**
13 **Sec. 2. Section 1 of this chapter does not prohibit the broadcast**
14 **or disclosure of identifying information other than:**
15 (1) a Social Security number;
16 (2) a driver's license number; or
17 (3) a state identification card number;
18 **to the public by other means, including news reports, press**
19 **conferences, silver or Amber alerts, wanted notices, Internet web**
20 **site postings, and similar methods specifically intended to inform**
21 **the public.**
22 SECTION 4. IC 31-39-3-2 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
23 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2022]: Sec. 2. **Except for**
24 **information listed in IC 5-14-3-4(a)(1) through IC 5-14-3-4(a)(15),**
25 the following information contained in records involving allegations of
26 delinquency that would be a crime if committed by an adult is

- 1 considered public information:
- 2 (1) The nature of the offense allegedly committed and the
- 3 circumstances immediately surrounding the alleged offense,
- 4 including the time, location, and property involved.
- 5 (2) The identity of any victim.
- 6 (3) A description of the method of apprehension.
- 7 (4) Any instrument of physical force used.
- 8 (5) The identity of any officers assigned to the investigation,
- 9 except for the undercover units.
- 10 (6) The age and sex of any child apprehended or sought for the
- 11 alleged commission of the offense.
- 12 (7) The identity of a child, if the child is apprehended or sought
- 13 for the alleged commission of:
- 14 (A) an offense over which a juvenile court does not have
- 15 jurisdiction under IC 31-30-1-2 and IC 31-30-1-4; or
- 16 (B) an act specified under IC 31-30-3-3."
- 17 Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
