by inserting immediately after said line the following:

"167.638. 1. The department of health and senior services shall develop an informational brochure relating to meningococcal disease, and that an immunization against meningococcal disease is available. The department shall make the brochure available on its website and shall notify each school district and charter school in this state of the availability of the brochure. Each school district and charter school shall provide a copy of the brochure to parents. Such information in the brochure shall include:

(1) The risk factors for developing meningococcal disease, the symptoms of meningococcal disease, how it may be diagnosed, and its possible consequences if untreated;

(2) How meningococcal disease is transmitted;

(3) The latest scientific information on the immunization against meningococcal disease and the immunization's effectiveness;

(4) A statement that any questions or concerns regarding immunizing the child against meningococcal disease could be answered by contacting the family's health care provider.

2. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined

1 in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated  
2 in this section shall become effective only if it complies with  
3 and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if  
4 applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are  
5 nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general  
6 assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the  
7 effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are  
8 subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking  
9 authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2013,  
10 shall be invalid and void."; and

14 "174.335. 1. Beginning with the 2004-2005 school year and  
15 for each school year thereafter, every public institution of  
16 higher education in this state shall require all students who  
17 reside in on-campus housing to [sign a written waiver stating  
18 that the institution of higher education has provided the  
19 student, or if the student is a minor, the student's parents or  
20 guardian, with detailed written information on the risks  
21 associated with meningococcal disease and the availability and  
22 effectiveness of] have received the meningococcal vaccine unless  
23 a signed statement of medical or religious exemption is on file  
24 with the institution's administration. A student shall be  
25 exempted from the immunization requirement of this section upon  
26 signed certification by a doctor licensed under chapter 334,  
27 indicating that either the immunization would seriously endanger  
28 the student's health or life or the student has documentation of  
29 disease or laboratory evidence of immunity to the disease. A

1 student shall be exempted from the immunization requirement of  
2 this section if he or she objects in writing to the institution's  
3 administration that immunization violates his or her religious  
4 beliefs.

5 2. [Any student who elects to receive the meningococcal  
6 vaccine shall not be required to sign a waiver referenced in  
7 subsection 1 of this section and shall present a record of said  
8 vaccination to the institution of higher education.

9 3.] Each public university or college in this state shall  
10 maintain records on the meningococcal vaccination status of every  
11 student residing in on-campus housing at the university or  
12 college[, including any written waivers executed pursuant to  
13 subsection 1 of this section]. The department of health and  
14 senior services shall oversee, supervise, and secure the  
15 enforcement of this section. The department of health and senior  
16 services may promulgate rules and regulations governing the  
17 requirements of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as  
18 that term is defined in section 536.010 that is created under the  
19 authority delegated in this section shall become effective only  
20 if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of  
21 chapter 536, and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section  
22 and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested  
23 with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, to review, to  
24 delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are  
25 subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking  
26 authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2013,  
27 shall be invalid and void.

28 [4.] 3. Nothing in this section shall be construed as  
29 requiring any institution of higher education to provide or pay

1       for vaccinations against meningococcal disease."; and
