

Amendment to HB 565-FN

1 Amend the title of the bill by replacing it with the following:

3 AN ACT establishing a committee to study supervised visitation centers.

5 Amend the bill by replacing all after the enacting clause with the following:

7 1 Committee Established. There is established a committee to study supervised visitation
8 centers.

9 2 Membership and Compensation.

10 I. The members of the committee shall be as follows:

11 (a) Four members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house
12 of representatives.

13 (b) One members of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.

14 II. Members of the committee shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to
15 the duties of the committee.

16 3 Duties. The committee shall study the establishment of additional supervised visitation
17 centers in the state. The study shall include consideration of the need for supervised visitation
18 centers in different geographic areas of the state, the structure and operational costs of such centers,
19 and available funding sources. The committee may solicit information and testimony from any
20 individual or entity the committee deems relevant to its study.

21 4 Chairperson; Quorum. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from
22 among the members. The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named house
23 member. The first meeting of the committee shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this
24 section. Three members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.

25 5 Report. The committee shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed
26 legislation to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, the house
27 clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1, 2020.

28 6 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
