9 An Act relating to resource centers; requiring  
10 Department of Human Services to ensure that an entity  
11 providing services to certain individuals be assessed  
12 annually; providing certain quality standards;  
13 requiring certain providers to participate in certain  
14 assessments; providing for codification; and  
15 providing an effective date.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1409.1 of Title 10, unless there  
19 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 The Department of Human Services shall ensure that an entity  
21 approved to provide residential services, day services, identified  
22 day habilitation, or vocational services to individuals who were  
23 residents at the Northern Oklahoma Resource Center of Enid or the  
24 Southern Oklahoma Resource Center of Pauls Valley on November 1,  
2012, shall be assessed annually by the Quality Assurance Unit of  
the Developmental Disabilities Services Division of the Oklahoma

1 Department of Human Services for compliance with contract and policy  
2 expectations through the performance review process and successfully  
3 complete the fiscal year with no outstanding issues of  
4 noncompliance. In assuring the health and safety of these  
5 individuals, compliance shall include but not be limited to  
6 standards related to individual plan implementation, medication  
7 administration, staff training, employment background checks, and  
8 incident reporting including the reporting of maltreatment. Failure  
9 to comply shall result in sanctions as described in Department  
10 policy. All such providers shall participate in Oklahoma-Advocates  
11 Involved in Monitoring (OK AIM) assessments and all other  
12 Developmental Disabilities Services Division quality assurance  
13 initiatives designed to assess the quality of service delivery.

14 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2013.
