9	COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE
10	An Act relating to motor vehicles; creating the port-
11	of-entry officer division within the Oklahoma Corporation Commission; providing certain authority
12	and duties; requiring certain training; providing uniform requirements; specifying apportionment of
13	certain funds; authorizing certain purchase authority; authorizing the promulgation of rules;
14	providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1204 of Title 47, unless there
20	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	A. There is hereby created within the Corporation Commission
22	the Port-of-Entry Officer Division which shall consist of such
23	employees the Commission deems necessary to carry out the provisions
2.4	of this act

B. The officers of the division shall be stationed at various point along the U.S. highway system within the state and at all port-of-entry weigh stations as defined by Section 1201 of this title and have the following authority, responsibilities, powers and duties:

- 1. To enforce the provisions of this title, US 49 CFR, and any other law regulating the operation of commercial motor vehicles or the use of the highways, including, but not limited to, the Motor Carriers Act of this state, and the Weigh Station Act of this state;
- 2. To arrest without writ, rule, order or process any person detected by them in the act of violating any law of this state;
- 3. To enforce and prevent the violation of the laws relating to the size, weight of commercial motor vehicles and all laws designed for the protection of the highway pavements and structures on such highways;
- 4. To assist at the request of another state agency to direct all traffic in conformance with law and, in the event of an emergency, or to expedite traffic, or to insure safety, to direct traffic as conditions may require, notwithstanding the provisions of law;
- 5. To serve all warrants relating to the enforcement of the laws regulating the operation of vehicles or the use of the highways and bench warrants issued for nonpayment of fines and costs for moving traffic violations;

C. All port-of-entry officers shall be certified with the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training.

- D. The Department of Public Safety shall provide the training for all port-of-entry officers for the enforcement of size, weights and inspections related to the provisions of this act. All port-of-entry officers shall receive the same training as a Highway Patrol officer in the enforcement of size, weights and inspections.
- E. The Department of Public Safety shall offer a forty-hour continuing education course on criminal law and alcohol and drug detection to all port-of-entry officers annually.
- F. All port-of-entry officers shall at all times while on duty be required to be dressed in a distinctive uniform and display a badge of office, both of which shall be completely different and distinguishable from those of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol and other transportation officer within the Corporation Commission. All such badges shall be furnished by the Commission and each badge shall display a distinctive serial number. The type and detail of the uniforms shall be designated by the Commission and the Commission shall furnish the uniforms and replace them when necessary.
- G. Any citations issued by officers pursuant to US 49 CFR and this act shall be apportioned to the following:
- 1. Seventy-five percent (75%) shall be apportioned to the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund;

- 2. Twenty percent (20%) shall be apportioned to the Corporation Commission Revolving Fund for uniforms, training and equipment related to this act; and
- 3. Five percent (5%) shall be apportioned to the various counties in equal amounts and deposited into the county highway fund of the respective counties.
- H. The Corporation Commission is authorized to purchase and maintain necessary equipment and supplies and shall provide proper training necessary for the enforcement of the provisions of this section. The commission is also authorized to promulgate rules to carry out the provisions of this act.
- 12 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2014.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
