**Bill Analysis**

SB 112 prohibits anyone convicted of a crime committed before the age of eighteen from receiving a sentence of life without parole or a mandatory minimum sentence. The measure also mandates that the courts must consider the age of the person at the time of the offense, level of maturity, culpability, family and environment, intellectual capacity, peer pressure, capacity for rehabilitation, community involvement, and involvement in the child welfare system when sentencing a person certified as an adult.
